To all garden friends !!!

The garden community is mainly for the recreation of its members.
We live in a voluntary community that can only work
if everyone takes care of everyone. Only then will this also be for the joy of all.

**For all new - and also "old" - gardeners,
for a given occasion and as a reminder,
Below are some important points from the garden system.**

- Ideally, the 3/3 division of the garden applies.
1/3 cultivation, 1/3 lawn, 1/3 closed area (= "House 24 m²" + walkways + free terrace).
- The fixed, closed development of the parcel is legally limited to max. 24 m² (including adjoining roof) limited.
- Every structural, firmly anchored change in the garden must first be communicated to the Executive Board. Otherwise, this must be removed again.
Approval of the development requires the approval of the Executive Board and the district association.
- The erection of a greenhouse must first be approved by the Executive Board.
- Daily rest periods must be observed by all (exact rules, see garden regulations).
Exceptions to rest periods for construction measures can be requested from the Board.
- Collaborative work serves the care of our entire facility,
promotes interpersonal contact and understanding among each other.
- Every gardener has his garden door side, as well as half the way to groom.
Opposite areas to the outer fences, or sidewalks, are maintained by the community work.
- Garden waste should ideally be composted or disposed of by itself. (Take away).
Garden waste should not be disposed of in the forest. (Prosecution by the public order office).
(Exception: leaves from the adjacent forest)
- Remains of a barbecue party! (... Please :Take away). Even more important: food, bone remains, etc.,
neither on the compost, and certainly not in the forest! We have enough rats!
- The farmer cuts the hedges to the sidewalks from the inside, from the outside the club.
The farmer discards the hedge trimming in the trough provided by the association.
(annual dates: see notice)
- Push bicycles and leash dogs. (And please, we leave nothing in front of your garden gate.)

The repeated disregard for voluntary agreements within a community,
leads to exclusion from this community.
